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CHAPTER 5.6. California Healthy Youth Act

The purposes of this chapter are as follows:

- (1) To provide pupils with the knowledge and skills necessary to protect their sexual and reproductive health from HIV and other sexually transmitted infections and from unintended pregnancy.
- (2) To provide pupils with the knowledge and skills they need to develop healthy attitudes concerning adolescent growth and development, body image, gender, sexual orientation, relationships, marriage, and family.
- (3) To promote understanding of sexuality as a normal part of human development.
- (4) To ensure pupils receive integrated, comprehensive, accurate, and unbiased sexual health and HIV prevention instruction and provide educators with clear tools and guidance to accomplish that end.
- (5) To provide pupils with the knowledge and skills necessary to have healthy, positive, and safe relationships and behaviors.

Each school district shall ensure that all pupils in grades 7 to 12, inclusive, receive comprehensive sexual health education and HIV prevention education from instructors trained in the appropriate courses. Each pupil shall receive this instruction at least once in junior high or middle school and at least once in high school. This instruction shall include all of the following:

living with HIV and reduce the likelihood of transmitting HIV	
to others.	
(7) Discussion about social views on HIV and AIDS, including	355
addressing unfounded stereotypes and myths regarding HIV	



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and AIDS and people living with HIV. This instruction shall	
emphasize that successfully treated HIV-positive individuals	
have a normal life expectancy, all people are at some risk of	
contracting HIV, and the only way to know if one is HIV	
positive is to get tested.	
(8) Information about local resources, how to access local	348; 354-355; 631-632
resources, and pupils' legal rights to access local resources	
for sexual and reproductive health care such as testing and	
medical care for HIV and other sexually transmitted	
infections and pregnancy prevention and care, as well as	
local resources for assistance with sexual assault and	
intimate partner violence.

Instruction on pregnancy shall include an objective	
discussion of all legally available pregnancy outcomes,	
including, but not limited to, all of the following:
